# Member Profile Bob Parr

Bob Parr had been a lifetime on the Bay already, when he took the Boating Course and became a squadron member in 1974. Bob worked with the Coast Guard from age 16 to retirement, following in the wake of four generations of Georgian Bay commercial fishers, some of whom began under canvas.

Today, he and his wife Sandra enjoy their steel tug *Mink Isle*, purchased in 1983. It's a Georgian Bay boat, built as *Brompton Duchess*, at the shipyards of Russel Bros in Owen Sound, in 1947. She's 50 feet long, with a beam of 13'6". She towed logs in Lake Superior near Nipigon till 1972. Sold and used in building the St Joseph Island Bridge in the Soo, she was "in rough shape" when Bob found her. Bob and Sandra replaced the engine and smoke stack, raised the roof, added TLC, and made it theirs as *Mink Isle*.

Bob grew up on Bay Street, close enough to keep an eye on the family net sheds and their boats at the dock. Today he and Sandra live a few yards away from his family's original home, a feature of century-old photos and paintings of the street. He can still keep an eye on the dock and the Inner Sound from their house.

## **VHF RADIO COURSE**

A two-evening course in operation of VHF radios is to be offered on March 23<sup>rd</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, both Monday evenings, from 6:30 until 9:00, with an exam to be written on the 30<sup>th</sup>. The fee is \$75 and interested persons are asked to contact Training Officer Lindsay Chafe, at training@parrysoundsquadron.ca

For those who cruise, VHF remains a crucial link with the shore or other boats, as well as the best source for weather information and notices to mariners. It is the mariner's hot-line

for assistance or offer of assistance and, for clarity of communication, there is a particular protocol to be followed. Fines are severe if you are not licensed.

If you do not have VHF training, we recommend this course very highly. If you have already, but still need the DSC endorsement, this is your opportunity.

The course location will be Room 160 at the High School.
